
## Impact and Development of Sport, Physical Activity and P.E. post January 2014.

Prior to January 2014, Westminster Primary School offered a P.E. curriculum meeting national targets and standards. Also on offer were three extra-curricular activity clubs in the form of football, multi-sports and cricket. There was one member of staff employed specifically for sports delivery and two play leaders for facilitated play during break times. Prior to January 2014, competitive sport at Westminster Primary School was limited, with Level 1 intra-school competition requiring improvement.



Since January 2014, Westminster Primary School has a dedicated sport and physical activity delivery team made up of the Director of Sport, a full-time Sports Coach and four Play Leaders. As a result of this development, Westminster Primary School has increased extra-curricular sport and activity clubs by 567%. In addition to this increase in quantity, the diversity of sport on offer has also been expanded. Sports delivered in extra-curricular clubs now include lacrosse, hockey, archery, boccia, kurling and goalball. These more obscure sports have bolstered the extra-curricular offer providing opportunities for children to experience activities previously unavailable.

The curriculum delivery plan (appendix 1) has also been overhauled, leading to Key Stage specific delivery plans. These delivery plans cater for EYFS, Key Stage 1, Lower Key Stage 2 and Upper Key Stage 2 and are mapped directly to National Curriculum Outcomes. Each delivery plan has specific and measured outcomes for each child. Children are assessed during each module (appendix 2) in order to track performance and identify both areas for development and those who are excelling. From this data, Gifted and Talented Sports Development Clubs have been created to enable children to pursue excellence in specific areas of sport.

Competitive sport at Westminster Primary School is now an integrated element of delivery with Level 1 competitive opportunities available on a daily basis. Children are selected to attend competitive opportunities based on their ability and enthusiasm. Since January 2014, Westminster Primary School have placed first in 13 Level 2 competitive opportunities, second in 3 competitive opportunities and third in 1 opportunity. In addition to this success, Westminster Primary School was successful in promotion to the 2014 Level 3 City Games.

In July 2014, Westminster Primary School held a whole school Sports Day. Prior to January 2014, sports activities were delivered to year groups as a whole. This event involved the entire school cohort taking part in nine competitive activities throughout the day including both individual and team sports.

From March 2014, Westminster Primary became a British Gymnastics Partner School, investing in new equipment and club development. Children now have access to a variety of specialist equipment including springboards, beam and vault. As a school, we have also adopted the nationally recognised accreditation system of Gymnastics Proficiency Awards and Key Steps. These programmes will ensure that children are able to meet national standards in Gymnastics, achieving internationally recognised accreditation in the process.

Consolidating and recognising these improvements has been part of our approach. As a result of our expansion and development, Westminster Primary School was awarded Youth Sport Trust Gold status in 2014. As a direct recognition of improvements and development in competitive sport, Westminster Primary School has successfully achieved the Sainsbury's School Games Silver Kitemark, being the only school in our SGO's partnership to make a successful application.

Finally, from September 2014, expansion will continue to develop and improve the standard of delivery through staff CPD. We will re-apply to maintain our status as a Youth Sport Trust Gold member and strive to increase our Sainsbury's School Games kitemark from silver to gold.
